Re: Inquiry into the Work Programme – users experience

As Chair of UKCoD, I would like to welcome the opportunity to provide evidence to the select committee on the above.

UKCoD is an umbrella charity in the field of deafness, representing over 100 member organisations. We have a special interest group, that has been working closely with officials from DWP around issues related to deaf people gaining the maximum benefit from Access to Work and as part of that work we have looked at the Work Programme and deaf peoples experiences of the programme.
